Edith Benson wanted to begin her legacy during her lifetime. She wanted to encourage underprivileged college students to intern at the History Center with a paid internship that her fund would support.

She established a fund and contributes to this fund annually. She has also included this fund in her will. Because of her generosity, students will gain work experience and learn museum operations. Perhaps these students will choose a museum career when they graduate.
